Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ,

We have been on a journey over the last eight months. I am grateful for the honor of being your pastor, of returning to my roots and shepherding those who shepherd me in my youth, it has been a humbling experience. There is still a sense of disconnect due to the scheduling of Sunday morning worship, and I am interested in any ideas on how I can better connect and serve you. I have heard a few people say to me they don't want to bother me because they know how busy I am. Yes, I am busy, we are all busy, but I am your pastor and I am never too busy for someone in need. I want to emphasize I have office hours in Windsor every Tuesday from 9:30am-12:30pm, but I am also available by appointment any other time.

As we enter the Lenten season, I ask you to pause and reflect about your relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Reflect on the words of the prophet Joel 2:12-13:



"Even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning."

"Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love and he relents from sending calamity."

We are called to seek first the kingdom of God. The kingdom of God can be described as the world and how God intended it to be, starting with our lives, as they are intended to be. Ron Heifetz, founding director of the Center for Public Leadership at the Kennedy School, shares the following example about seeing the world as it is, and then imaging the world as it was meant to be.

Heifetz states in the life of a Christ-follower, in our personal lives, we are to take a fearless moral inventory seeing our lives, our thought patterns, our habits, our words and actions as they really are. And then, as we consider the words of Jesus, to imagine our lives as they are meant to be if God is reigning in our hearts. And with the help of the Holy Spirit, to pray and yearn to close the gap. I encourage you during this Lenten season to do an inventory of your heart to find the gaps where you are separated from God and to pray about the actions God wants you to take to close the gaps.



and join the fun!



WINDSOR UMC CHURCH COUNCIL AND FINANCE TEAM NOTES:


- **NOTE:** The <u>Council</u> met on January 28, 2025. We did not meet in February 2025 or November/ December 2024. Minutes from all meetings can be found on the table in the church narthex. If you wish a copy sent to you, please contact Sue Bennett.
- Our next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 25 at 6:30pm. Minutes from our January meeting will be approved at that time and made available.
- The <u>Finance Team</u> meets quarterly. Our 2025 meeting was held on Tuesday, March 11 at 6:00pm.
- A 2025 Budget was presented and approved by Council at the October meeting.
- The 2024 church Annual Audit was completed by Gail Bagg and submitted to the conference. Many thanks to those who provided the necessary information to Gail (especially Ellen, our Treasurer), and we thank Gail for her dedication to providing a thorough audit.
- A list of <u>Trustee</u> work was provided in a previous <u>Lamplighter</u> and an update of the work as reported in the October 2024 Council minutes is as follows:
- New iPad donated by Ben Amberge. Will be working to set up the cameras and Facebook live broadcasts.
- Getting quotes for driveway repaving. Estimates are between \$40-60,000.
- Roof issues were found, addressed and repaired.
- A better price found for salting this winter.
- Interior emergency exit lights were replaced.
- New remote(s) to control the heat.
- Outside lights replaced. A neighbor commented that the lights are too bright and another one was out. Both lights are fixed.
- Heat oil pumps showing a savings of half of the cost from before. \$500.00 credit was used to re fill fuel oil.
- Jeannie asked the question about whether the speakers could be reconnected to add sound to nursery & fellowship hall. Looking into using the old iPad to connect to FB service.
- Jeannie & Roger dug up the daffodils from the flower boxes when they were taken out. The idea is to plant them in front of & around the church sign and shrubbery. Set a day of the week, November 5th at 2 pm to have folks come help with this project.

We may be looking into hearing assistance for sound in the sanctuary, possibly adding sound so that the service may be heard in the nursery, looking into adding different angles for video production of livestream (may use old iPhones or iPads). The tech team will hold a meeting involving Gail Bagg, Jenna and Ben Amberge, John McNulty, Matt, Laurie and Matthew Wightman. The meeting will be held sometime in March. Matt Wightman mentioned that one of our MEVO cameras is broken on the base from being dropped off of the pew.

Linda Phelps reported that more people are welcome to join the choir. Rehearsals are on Wednesday evenings. The committee asked if she needed any additional support. They thanked her for all that she has done to add music to the service.

Lenten Service Schedule has been set.

"Ash Wednesday Service" will be held at the First United Methodist Church of Deposit on Wednesday, March 5th at 7:00 p.m. This is a time change due to Grief Share now meeting on Wednesdays (starting February 26th from 4:30 p.m.-6:30 p.m.) Originally it was planned for 6:30 p.m. Laurie will make a sign-up sheet for anyone who needs a ride or is interested in carpooling. Pastor Debra stated that she has all of the ashes that she needs.

"Easter Cantata" will be held at the First United Methodist Church of Deposit on Palm Sunday, April 13th at 3:00 p.m.

"Service of the Shadows" will be held at the First United Methodist Church of Windsor on Thursday, April 17th at 6:30 p.m. 13 people are needed to participate. 
The committee asked Pastor Debra in what ways we could support her.

As I reflect back on my first year as the Mission Committee Chairperson, there are so many things that I am grateful for with the love and support of this church. As we are in the season of Lent, I am reminded of Proverbs 16:3, which states, "*Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established.*"

In the Fall of 2024, we provided a take-out dinner for the Binghamton Community, which was held

at Fairview United Methodist Church. This is a quarterly mission project for our church and anyone is welcome to help. In January of this year, we served 107 meals at Fairview UMC.

In November, we collected well over a hundred boxes of stuffing mixes to provide to Windsor Human Development for their community Thanksgiving baskets. Also in November, we sent 33 shoeboxes to Endwell United Methodist Church. From there, they were shipped to the Red Bird Mission in Kentucky. A total of over 2500 shoeboxes were packed throughout the churches in the Upper New York Region.



Each box was filled with essentials such as personal hygiene items, toys and school supplies. I am thankful for the members of the church and especially our Sunday School youth who not only helped shop for the items, but also boxed the items.

In October, we once again distributed glow necklaces on Halloween to help keep the children and adults in our community safe and visible. In December, we collected clothing items, stamps, playing cards for our Jail Ministry Outreach. In February, we had our 2nd Annual "Souper Bowl" Sunday. We collected 131 cans of soup, Spaghettios, and ravioli for our God's Bread Food Pantry.

Our next community take-out meal will be held at Fairview UMC on Monday, April 28th. If you are interested in volunteering for this, please see Laurie Wightman or Carol Carpenetti. A sign-up sheet will be on the bulletin board in the Narthex.

UMCOR Sunday is on March 30th and we hope that you will kindly consider a donation for this global ministry.

Our next Mission Committee Meeting will be held in Room 7 at the church on Tuesday, April 29th at 5:30 p.m. Anyone is welcome to attend. My prayer is that we continue to "lean in, pray, listen to God, and help those in need."
