Many of our congregation are unable to attend church in person and by offering our worship services on Facebook Live we are able to reach many.





#### New Business:

<u>The ERC (Employee Retention Credit)</u> through Church Windows, our accounting system) and the IRS. Lisa applied for the credit in October 2021 when we kept our employees on and had a mandated shut down due to the Covid pandemic. We are eligible to receive up to \$21,377.02 at a cost of \$200 per quarter to Church Windows, totaling \$1200.
